August 16, 2021

A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 16th day of August, 2021 at the Butler County Courthouse Supervisors Meeting Room in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Present were the following: Anthony Whitmore, Tony Krafka, Scot Bauer, David Mach, Jan Sypal, Robert Coufal, and Ryan Svoboda.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The main concern expressed was the safety of the kids. Currently they can walk from school to the courthouse for activities, whereas that wouldn't be possible if the extension office was moved. Also, the amount of people that are able to stop into the courthouse while doing other business in David City. They asked if there was a timeline for the move and the board said they were currently just looking at options and nothing was going to change at this time.

Human Resources Update

Heidi Loges, Human Resources Director, appeared before the board and asked the board about flu vaccinations and if the county wanted to pay for them again. The board said that they usually do and that they usually vote on it. The board asked to put it on the agenda for the next meeting. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS BUTLER COUNTY, NEBRASKA RESOLUTION NO. 2021 – 30

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Nebraska Statute 77-3443, each County Board shall adopt a resolution by a majority vote of members present which determines a final allocation of levy authority to its political subdivisions, and





WHEREAS, political subdivisions as defined in said statute are "all political subdivisions <u>other</u> than school districts, community colleges, natural resources districts, educational service units, cities, villages, counties, rural and suburban fire protection districts that have levy authority pursuant to subsection (10) of section 77-3442, and sanitary and improvement districts, and

WHEREAS, statute states that they may levy taxes as provided by law, provided they do not collectively total more than fifteen cents per one hundred dollars of taxable valuation on any parcel or item of taxable property for all governments for which allocations are made by the County, and

WHEREAS, on or before August 1st, all political subdivisions subject to county levy authority must submit a preliminary request for levy allocation to the County Board, and

WHEREAS, failure of a political subdivision to do so shall preclude them from using procedures set forth in 77-3444, and

WHEREAS, Butler County has twenty-seven (27) such political subdivisions namely: Butler County Agricultural Society, Read Township, Ulysses Township, Plum Creek Township, Richardson Township, Reading Township, Union Township, Center Township, Oak Creek Township, Summit Township, Olive Township, Franklin Township, Skull Creek Township, Alexis Township, Savannah Township, Bone Creek Township, Linwood Township, Platte Township, Ulysses Fire District #2, Rising City Fire District #3, Bellwood Fire District #5, Dwight Fire District #6, Bruno Fire District #7, Linwood Fire District #8, David City Fire District #9, Brainard Fire District #10 and Abie Fire District #11.

The board asked about the event, and Hernandez said it is a fundraiser for Omaha Nitro Futbol Club. The fundraiser will help kids get scholarships for soccer and for traveling. The board informed Ms. Hernandez that they would appreciate at least 30 days' notice for an event like this as well as notification of the County Sheriff.

Roads Update

Novacek updated the board that Randy Isham was at a webinar today and that is why he couldn't be present at the meeting. He said that the road crews are currently working in Richardson township replacing culverts and putting in a few driveways. They continue to haul gravel although they do have a truck that broke down and hope to have it back up and running by the end of the week. Sypal asked Novacek what to do about farmers planting in the right of way. She had two complaints over the weekend, the complaints were in Svoboda's district. She said she drove out there and the complaints were accurate. Novacek said that any complaints should be directed to Randy right away, so he can address them and then notify the landowner. County Attorney, Julie Reiter, stated that there are steps they must take, and she and Randy have discussed the steps regarding this matter. It was also discussed that if any accident occurs on the county roads, the sheriff needs to notify the roads department so they can complete their own investigation and file the necessary reports they need to file. Novacek said they are working on a notice to put in the paper regarding farming the right of way. The board asked if there was an update regarding the Linwood water drainage issue. The surveyor had been down there and there is an issue with the road and the center line; and unless the water can be diverted somehow there currently isn't a solution for the issue.

Approval of Purchase Agreement for sale of Shelby Clinic to the Village of Shelby



RESOLUTION 2021 - 29

A Resolution of the Butler County Board of Supervisors Opposing Executive Order 14008 entitled tackling climate crisis at home and abroad (86 Red. Reg. 7,819).

WHEREAS, Butler County, Nebraska is a legal and political subdivision of the State of Nebraska for which the Butler County Board of Supervisors is authorized to act; and

WHEREAS, on January 27, 2021, the President of the United States of America, issued Executive Order 14008 entitled Tackling Climate Crisis at Home and Abroad (86 Fed. Reg. 7,619); and

WHEREAS, in section 216 of Executive Order 14008, the President of the United States of America directed the Secretary of the Interior, in consultation with the Secretary of Agriculture, the Secretary of Commerce, the Chair of the Council of Environmental Quality, and the heads of other relevant agencies, to submit a report to the Task Force within 90 days of the date of the Order recommending steps that the United States should take, working with State, local Tribal and territorial governments, agricultural and forest landowners, fishermen, and other key stakeholders, to achieve the goal of conserving at least 30 percent of our lands and waters by 2030; and

WHEREAS, further in Section 216, (i) the Secretary of the Interior, the Secretary of Agriculture, the Secretary of Commerce, through the Administrator of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, and the Chair of the Council on Environmental Quality shall, as appropriate, solicit input from State, local, Tribal and territorial officials, agricultural and forest landowners, fishermen, and other key stakeholders in identifying strategies that will encourage broad participation in the goal of conserving 30 percent of our lands and waters by 2030; and

WHEREAS, further in Section 216, (ii) the report to be submitted pursuant to the Executive Order shall propose guidelines for determining whether lands and waters qualify for conservation, and it also shall establish mechanisms to measure progress toward the 30 percent goal; and

WHEREAS, the Butler County Board of Supervisors desires to oppose Executive Order 14008, specifically Section 216 as written and will continues to monitor the development of any regulations adopted pursuant to said Executive Order and the impact any such actions may have in Butler County, Nebraska.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by Butler County Board of Supervisors, that this Board does hereby oppose Executive Order 14008, specifically Section 216 as written, and that it will continue to monitor any actions or regulations adopted pursuant to the Executive Order as to the potential for impact in Butler County, Nebraska.





NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by Butler County Board of Supervisors, that this Board would at this time support Governor Pete Ricketts' Executive order 21-08 signed June 24th of 2021, a copy of which is attached to this Resolution.

Discussion/Possible Action regarding the Budget 2021 – 2022 update

The budget committee asked Laska to discuss the changes that were made and discuss the levy since receiving the certified numbers from the assessor. She reported that the budget committee met and cut \$10,000 from Data Processing in the general fund and also cut another \$110,000 from the Road department, which all came from the gravel line item, leaving the Road department with a gravel budget of approximately \$663,000. Those cuts took the county below the lid. Prior to receiving the certified values from the assessor, the levy was sitting at approximately .182245 which was up 3% over last year. Sypal asked if all budgets had been considered when making further cuts. The budget committee said they had looked at the Sheriff's budget again and discussed with the Sheriff regarding his request for patrol cars. They discussed his fleet and the age of some of the vehicles and the mileage. Alexis Buresh, office manager for the Sheriff, came in and said that the sheriff would like to be present for their discussion, but he was out on a call. The board tabled the discussion and moved on.

Discussion/Possible Action regarding wage increases for appointed employees

The board discussed the appointed employees and how they have typically determined wage increases in the past. Sypal asked if the board had ever considered doing a cost of living and then a performance raise. The members of the board who have been on for a while said they've never done that. Moved by Mach and seconded by Coufal to increase the appointed employees' wages 5%. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Mach, Coufal, Svoboda, Krafka, and Bauer. The following voted nay: NONE. Abstain: Sypal and Whitmore. Motion carried.

Discussion/Possible Action regarding appointing vacant committees for the remainder of 2021

Sheriff Dion came in to discuss his request for 3 patrol cars with the board. He said that this year he needs 3 and next year he plans to request only one. Bauer suggested he replace 2 cars this year and 2 cars next year to stay consistent. Further discussion ensued and the board discussed leaving the budget as it stands, the increase in tax request is \$204,623.15 over last year, which does increase the levy .005825 over last year to .182018. The board agreed that the approved increase in gravel alone warrants a small increase in the levy, not to mention the cost of living has increased so much over the last year. No action was taken at this time. The budget hearing will be held on August 31, 2021, at 9:00 a.m. at the Butler County Courthouse in the Board of Supervisors Room.

Committee Reports

Whitmore reported that he will be attending a Four Corners Meeting later this month.

There being no further business to come before the board, the Chairman adjourned the meeting at 12:18 p.m. The next scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors will be September 7, 2021, at 9:00 a.m. at the Butler County Courthouse Supervisors Meeting Room.
