August 15, 2022

A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 15th day of August, 2022 at the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Present were the following: Anthony Whitmore, Tony Krafka, Scot Bauer, David Mach, Jan Sypal, Robert Coufal and Ryan Syoboda.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

An annual report for the Hruska Public Library was presented before the board showing the county how the \$5,000 was spent for the last year; the library is asking for the same investment this year. BOARD OF SUPERVISORS BUTLER COUNTY, NEBRASKA RESOLUTION NO. 2022 – 18

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Nebraska Statute 77-3443, each County Board shall adopt a resolution by a majority vote of members present which determines a final allocation of levy authority to its political subdivisions, and

WHEREAS, political subdivisions as defined in said statute are "all political subdivisions <u>other</u> than school districts, community colleges, natural resources districts, educational service units, cities, villages, counties, rural and suburban fire protection districts that have levy authority pursuant to subsection (10) of section 77-3442, and sanitary and improvement districts, and

WHEREAS, statute states that they may levy taxes as provided by law, provided they do not collectively total more than fifteen cents per one hundred dollars of taxable valuation on any parcel or item of taxable property for all governments for which allocations are made by the County, and

WHEREAS, on or before August 1st, all political subdivisions subject to county levy authority must submit a preliminary request for levy allocation to the County Board, and

WHEREAS, failure of a political subdivision to do so shall preclude them from using procedures set forth in 77-3444, and

WHEREAS, Butler County has twenty-seven (26) such political subdivisions namely: Butler County Agricultural Society, Read Township, Ulysses Township, Plum Creek Township, Richardson Township, Reading Township, Union Township, Center Township, Oak Creek Township, Summit Township, Olive Township, Franklin Township, Skull Creek Township, Alexis Township, Savannah Township, Bone Creek Township, Linwood Township, Platte Township, Ulysses Fire District #2, Rising City Fire District #3, Bellwood Fire District #5, Dwight Fire District #6, Linwood Fire District #8, David City Fire District #9, Brainard Fire District #10 and Skull Creek Rural Fire District #12.

Committee Reports

Svoboda reported he met with the landfill regarding future applications and proposals.

Certificate of Service Presentation

Chairman Whitmore presented Joey Ossian with a Certificate of Service for 5 years of Service with Butler County.

At 9:56 a.m. the chairman declared the board would take a break.

At 10:00 a.m. the board reconvened.

Approval of Salt Mine City Brewing Company Special Designated License for October 8, 2022

Marty Roper appeared before the board requesting a special designated license for October 8, 2022 at the Butler County Fairgrounds. Moved by Sypal, seconded by Mach to approve the SDL as presented. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Sypal, Mach, Bauer, Krafka, Svoboda, Coufal, and Whitmore. The following voted aye: NONE. Motion carried.

Discussion/Possible action regarding Budget 2022-2023 update

Laska reported the Budget committee is recommending the following cuts: Road Department \$170,000; Sheriff Department \$25,000; Insurance \$10,000; Emergency Management \$12,476.41. They are also recommending a transfer from the Inheritance Fund of \$600,000. She informed the board that the budget is within the lid and budget authority. Due to time the board tabled this topic to move on with the agenda and would come back to it at the end.

Discussion/Possible action regarding health insurance deductible difference between BCBS & Aetna





Mike Boden, NACO representative, appeared before the board to discuss the County's health insurance deductibles while with Blue Cross Blue Shield in the month of July and then the move to Aetna in August. The deductible with BCBS was \$2,600 and the deductible with Aetna was \$2,500. Those employees that met their deductible in July would have \$100 more than those that hit it before July and after July. The board discussed that it was their decision to move insurance companies, therefore, they would absorb the \$100 difference. Moved by Mach, seconded by Svoboda to absorb the additional \$100 cost in deductible between BCBS and Aetna. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Mach, Sypal, Coufal, Svoboda, Krafka, Bauer, and Whitmore. The following voted nay: NONE. Motion carried.

Discussion/Possible action regarding Budget 2022-2023 update continued

Laska also reported that the 12-year average for the levy is .184589; the proposed levy with the above cuts and transfers is 0.178161; which is 3.48% lower than the average. The board reviewed the Road Department again and cut another \$2,675 from the budget. The result lowered the levy to 0.178054. Laska reported that the Budget hearing has been set for September 6, 2022 at 1:00 p.m. No other changes in the budget were discussed.

There being no further business to come before the board, the Chairman adjourned the meeting at 11:06 a.m. The next scheduled meeting of the Board of Supervisors will be September 6, 2022, at 9:00 a.m.
