Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Chairman called the meeting to order, and announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted in the meeting room.

Certificates of Election for Tony Krafka, Max Birkel, and Gregory Janak were presented for the board's review, and will be filed in the office of the County Clerk.

Election of Chairman for 2017

The County Clerk called for nominations for Chairman of the Butler County Board of Supervisors. Max Birkel nominated David Mach, seconded by Kevin Slama.

With no other nominations, Scott Steager moved and Greg Janak seconded to cease nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for David Mach as Chairman of the Butler County Board of Supervisors. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Steager, Janak, Birkel, Potter, Slama, and Krafka. The following voted nay: None. Abstaining: David Mach. Motion carried.

Election of Vice-Chairman for 2017

Greg Janak nominated Max Birkel, seconded by Kevin Slama.

With no other nominations, David Potter moved and Scott Steager seconded to cease nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Max Birkel as Vice-Chairman of the Butler County Board of Supervisors. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Potter, Slama, Krafka, Steager, Janak, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Abstaining: Birkel. Motion carried.

The Chairman declared the minutes from the previous meeting shall stand approved as presented.

Discussion

Discussion was held regarding a strip of land located in Section 10 of Linwood Township that is listed on the plat map as being owned by Butler County. Supervisor Potter will be contacting the County Surveyor to complete a search of the real estate records to verify ownership.

Township Official Bond and Oath

The Public Official Bond and Oath for Marvin E. Andel, Union Township Treasurer was presented for the board's consideration. Moved by Slama, seconded by Birkel to approve the Public Official Bond and Oath. Upon roll call vote

the following voted aye: Slama, Potter, Birkel, Janak, Steager, Krafka, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Motion carried.

County Treasurer's Statement

The County Treasurer's Statement for the period of July 1, 2016 to December 31, 2016 was presented for the board's review. The statement was accepted and will be placed on file.

Utility Permit Request

A utility permit request was submitted by Windstream Nebraska, Inc. to construct telecommunications facilities occupying the right-of-way of Butler County public roads, to repair bad buried splice, replace bad section of cable, and place a new pedestal labeled 1280I on County Road 41 between R Road and S Road. Moved by Slama, seconded by Steager to approve the permit request as presented. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Slama, Krafka, Steager, Janak, Birkel, Potter, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Motion carried.

Ulysses Bridge #5605

Discussion was held regarding bridge #5605, which is located southeast of Ulysses. Jim Rerucha, Highway Superintendent gave approximate cost estimates for repairing the bridge, and an approximate cost for replacing the bridge. This bridge project will be included in the 2017 One & Six Year Road Plan.

Interlocal Agreement with Agricultural Society

At the December 5, 2016 meeting, the board approved an Interlocal Agreement with the Butler County Agricultural Society, with the intention that the Agricultural Society would approve the same. The agreement was for snow removal from the lane and parking area of the Butler County Event Center in exchange for the use of an area in the southeast corner of the fairgrounds to store steel, culverts, etc. The Highway Superintendent was informed that the County would be responsible for fencing the area with chain link fencing, approximate cost of \$10,000.00. After further discussion with the Agricultural Society, the location of the storage area is being moved to the northeast corner of the racetrack area, adjacent to the County Yards. The area would also need to be fenced, but there is currently fencing in place on two sides. The area has been flagged by the Highway Superintendent, in order that the board members can view. A decision on this matter is tabled till the next meeting.

Proposed Projects for One & Six Year Road Plan

Jim Rerucha, Highway Superintendent discussed with the board some of the projects that will be included in the County's 2017 One & Six Year Road Plan. The Highway Superintendent asked that the board members contact him, if they have a proposed project they would want included.

Set Date and Time for One & Six Year Road Plan Public Hearing

Moved by Krafka, seconded by Birkel to set the date of February 21, 2017 at 9:30 a.m. to hold the One & Six Year Road Plan public hearing. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Krafka, Steager, Janak, Birkel, Potter, Slama, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Motion carried.

Discussion on Purchase of Truck & Motorgrader

The Highway Superintendent discussed the possible purchase of a semi-truck and motorgrader. Further discussion will be held at a future meeting.

Presentation on David City Downtown Redevelopment Project

Al Hottovy of Leo A Daly appeared before the board to present information on the David City Downtown Redevelopment Project and how it will impact the Courthouse square.

Decision on Document Preservation Project

At prior meetings, discussion was held regarding the problem that has been discovered with the acetate rolls of microfilm, containing the County Clerk's records, that are deposited with the State Archives, and relied on as a backup in case of a natural disaster. MIPS, Inc. Microfilming Division has inspected all the rolls and has offered three options for

fixing these rolls, or rescanning the original documents. During these discussions, it was suggested that the records in the County Surveyor's office be included in the project. Moved by Potter, seconded by Steager to approve Option 3 for the County Clerk's records, and to include the County Surveyor's records in the project. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Potter, Birkel, Janak, Steager, Krafka, Slama, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Motion carried.

Emergency Manager/911 Coordinator Report

Scott Steager, Emergency Manager/911 Coordinator submitted the 2016 Yearly Report to the board. The report was accepted and placed on file.

BUTLER COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS BOARD PROCEEDINGS

April 3, 2017

A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 3rd day of April, 2017 at the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Present were the following: David W. Mach, Tony Krafka, Kevin Slama, Scott Steager, Max Birkel, Gregory A. Janak, and David Potter.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Chairman called the meeting to order, and announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted in the meeting room.

The Chairman declared the minutes from the previous meeting shall stand approved as presented.

Utility Permit Request

Windstream Nebraska, Inc. is requesting permission to construct telecommunications facilities occupying the right-ofway of Butler County public roads, to provide new service to 2111 37 Road, Bruno, NE. Moved by Janak, seconded by Steager to approve the utility permit as requested. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Janak, Steager, Krafka, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Abstaining: Birkel. Absent: Slama and Potter. Motion carried.

Supervisors Slama and Potter arrived at 9:03 a.m.

Discussion/Building & Grounds

Discussion was held with Jim Rerucha, Highway Superintendent on the need for a larger county road shop building. The Highway Superintendent and Road and Bridge committee members toured the KV Supply building that is for sale. It was suggested by the board, that the Highway Superintendent research the cost of a new building, to be built at the county yards, and report back with his findings.

Alexis Township/Utility Right-of-Way

At the March 6, 2017 meeting, the Highway Superintendent informed the board that he had been contacted by Butler Public Power District pertaining to the replacement of poles for a transmission line. Following a survey of the area, it was found that the poles along B Road between 40 Road and 41 Road are located 2' into the road right-of-way, and the poles along 40 Road between B Road and C Road are located 8"-12" into the road right-of-way. The Alexis Township board was notified regarding this issue.

Doug Spale and David Nicolas, representing the Alexis Township board, told the board that this issue was discussed at the township board meeting and it was the consensus of the board to not allow placement of the utility poles in the road right-of-way. The county board has always followed the decision of the township boards, relating to these matters.

Discussion

Supervisor Mach reported that he had met with Rodney Macholan pertaining to road issues in the area of V Road and 46 Road. The board instructed the Highway Superintendent to inspect the area and state what was found and inform the individual what will be done and when in writing.

Supervisor Janak asked if Oak Creek Township or Richardson Township is responsible for the maintenance of 27 Road on the south side of the cemetery. The Highway Superintendent answered that Oak Creek Township is responsible.

Supervisor Potter asked if the County Driveway Policy had been adopted. The policy has not been adopted as of this time.

WHEREAS, both of the parties hereto are political subdivisions of the State of Nebraska; and,

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Cooperative Act, Neb. Rev. Stat. §13-801 to §13-827, permits local governmental units to make the most efficient use of their powers to enable them to cooperate with other governmental units in an effort to provide services and facilities in a manner that will accord with the needs of their local communities; and,

WHEREAS, Butler County and Saunders County wish to replace Bridge No. 505 on a county line road located on the 1/8 m line of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of Section Twenty-five (25), Township Seventeen (17) North, Range Four (4) East of the 6th P.M. in Butler County; and,

WHEREAS, said improvements include removal and disposal of existing 16' wooden bridge, purchase and installation of SCMP; and,

WHEREAS, said Counties agree that Butler County and Saunders County pay equal amounts (50-50) of the required drainage study, removal and disposal of the old structure, and the purchase and installation of the new structure, which costs will be divided equally; and,

WHEREAS, said Counties agree that Butler County will schedule the drainage study, contractor and perform construction inspection, and Butler County will apply and obtain all necessary permits; and,

WHEREAS, each County is responsible for acquiring all required right-of-way or temporary right-of-way easements in their respective county needed to construct the project; and,

WHEREAS, sufficient funds of Butler County and Saunders County are now, or will be, available and are hereby pledged at the required time for the purpose of paying for said project; and,

WHEREAS, each County that is a party to this contract agrees to indemnify and hold harmless, protect and defend the other as well as its elected and appointed officials, employees and representatives against any and all claims, demands, suits, actions, payments and judgments, including any and all costs and expenses connected herewith, for the damages asserted, claimed or recovered against the other or its insurers, because of personal injury, including bodily injury or death, or on account of property damage, in anyway connected with or resulting from the work associated with this agreement; and,

WHEREAS, each County shall maintain general liability insurance coverage of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 annual aggregate covering personal injury, including bodily injury and property damage involved with

this agreement. Each party will carry automobile liability limits of not less than \$1,000,000 single limit. Each party will maintain responsibility for providing its workers with workers' compensation coverage and or any claims associated with its employees.

NOW, THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED that Butler County and Saunders County hereby enter into agreement to replace bridge No. 505 located on the 1/8 m line of the Northeast Quarter (NE ¼) of Section Twenty-five (25), Township Seventeen (17) North, Range Four (4) East of the 6th P.M. in Butler County on the county line between Butler County and Saunders Counties, in accordance with the terms listed above.

Attachment-Payment in Lieu of Medical Insurance

Qualified employees who are eligible to receive individual health insurance coverage as an employee benefit may elect a cash payment of \$500 per month in lieu of their individual health and dental insurance coverage. To be eligible for this payment, the employee must be eligible for the individual health and dental coverage offered to a county employee and must sign a waiver of insurance declining the County's health insurance coverage with the County's health insurance provider. An employee may not opt in to the County's group plan until the next open enrollment period unless allowed by Group Plan regulations. RESOLUTION 2017-37 FOR AMENDMENT AND ADDENDUM TO NIRMA/NIRMA II INTERGOVERNMENTAL/INTERLOCAL AGREEMENTS

WHEREAS, these coverages and risk management services are essential for the continued effective and efficient use of county taxpayer dollars; and

WHEREAS, the current Intergovernmental/Interlocal Agreements will expire on June 30, 2018, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Butler County Board hereby:

- 1. Extends its commitment to participate in NIRMA and NIRMA II for the period of July 1, 2018 through June 30, 2021; and

A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 6th day of November, 2017 at the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Utility Permit/Windstream Nebraska, Inc.

Windstream Nebraska, Inc. proposes to raise the pedestal at Road V because of constant flooding, by boring under V Road to remove temporary cable on the ground and replace 1 old pair parallel conductor drop with a modern twisted 2 pair trenched and buried cable drop. December 4, 2017

A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 4th day of December, 2017 at the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Present were the following: David W. Mach, Tony Krafka, Kevin Slama, Max Birkel, Scott Steager, Greg Janak, and David Potter.

Due to an omission on the part of the publisher, advance notice of this meeting was not published. Notice of this meeting was given in advance by posting written notice in designated locations. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Chairman called the meeting to order, and announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted in the meeting room.

The Chairman declared that the minutes from the previous meeting shall stand approved as presented.

Utility Permit Request/Butler County Landfill

A permit to construct utilities on county right-of-way was submitted by Butler County Landfill. This matter is tabled until the Franklin Township Board has reviewed the permit request.

Discussion/Building Bridges for Private Property Access

Bridge Tonnage Signing

At this time TransCanada is still evaluating the Public Service Commission's decision on the route.

Charles Case, Jr. and Delores Case appeared before the board questioning access to their properties. They provided photos of a fence that was erected by the adjacent landowner. The County Attorney stated that this is not an issue for the Board of Supervisors or County.

Supervisor Krafka will request that the Bellwood Fire Chief accompany him to check out the access to these properties in case there would be a need for emergency vehicles.
