A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 7th day of January, 2019 at the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Road Department/Dwight-Brainard Highway Project

Mark Manelli, Manelli Wagner & Associates appeared before the board to discuss the overlay project on the Dwight-Brainard road. He presented a Paving Assessment report for the board to review, and relayed information about the project.

John Bruner and Joel Vrbka, Village of Brainard board members were present to discuss the inclusion of the road, on the west side of Brainard, from the State Spur to the Dwight-Brainard road in the overlay project.

The County Board members discussed that the Village of Dwight may want to include their portion of the road, on the west side of Dwight, and that the Village of Ulysses was interested in paving a portion of the road by the new fire station. Mr. Manelli, will meet with the respective village boards, and, if needed draft interlocal agreements between the county and the villages.

Road Department/Discussion

Plans for work on the intersection of 25 Road and U Road were reviewed with Mr. Manelli. Jim McDonald, Highway Superintendent said that the county forces will start on that project as soon as weather permits.

Road Department/Haul Route Agreement/TransCanada Keystone Pipeline, LP

Dan Forbes, Permit Supervisor for TransCanada Keystone Pipeline, LP, presented a Haul Route Agreement for the board's consideration. Moved by Janak, seconded by Steager to approve the agreement and authorize the Chairman to sign. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Janak, Steager, Krafka, Bauer, Whitmore, Birkel, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Motion carried.

Road Department/Replacement for B48 Pickup

The Highway Superintendent explained that the 2003 Chevrolet pickup that is used for sanding paved roads has mechanical issues and needs to be replaced. The board was provided the following four informal quotes for pickups to replace this unit:

A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 4th day of March, 2019 at the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Present were the following: David W. Mach, Tony Krafka, Scot Bauer, Max Birkel, Scott Steager, Greg Janak, and Anthony Whitmore.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present.

The Chairman called the meeting to order, and announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted in the meeting room.

The Chairman declared the minutes from the previous meeting shall stand approved as presented.

Road Department-

Interlocal Agreement with the City of David City

An Interlocal Agreement between Butler County and the City of David City for replacement of Bridge No. 804, located approximately 450' east of 13th Street on A Street in David City was presented for the board's consideration. Moved by Birkel, seconded by Steager to approve the agreement as presented. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Birkel, Janak, Steager, Krafka, Bauer, Whitmore, and Mach. The following voted nay: None. Motion carried.

Interlocal Agreement with Saunders County

An Interlocal Agreement between Butler County and Saunders County for construction of an armor coat on 39 Road between State Spur 12B and Y Road was presented for the board's consideration. Moved by Janak, seconded by Krafka to approve agreement as presented. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Janak, Steager, Krafka, Bauer, Whitmore, Birkel, and Mach. Gravel Pit Agreement

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS BUTLER COUNTY, NEBRASKA RESOLUTION NO. 2019-11

WHEREAS, Butler County, Nebraska ("Butler County") has or will incur significant expenses relating to flooding that occurred in Butler County this spring: and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that Butler County, Nebraska will receive federal and/or state disaster money as a result of this natural disaster; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the establishment of a new Disaster Fund should be established to allow the County to track expenses and receipts related to this disaster and any future disaster that may occur; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that a delay will occur between the time when expenses relating to the disaster must be paid and when disaster relief money will be received by the County and an initial loan in the amount of Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000) should be transferred into the Disaster Fund from the Inheritance Fund, said transfer being a loan which shall be transferred back to the Inheritance Fund once emergency relief moneys are received by the County from other sources.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Butler County Board of Supervisors, that the Butler County Disaster Fund, Fund Number 2575, is hereby established and approved. The fund shall consist of all emergency relief money received by the County, including but not limited to federal and state aid and any donations received by the County for disaster relief. The fund shall be used for payment of expenses incurred as a result of the 2019 flood and any other natural disaster occurring in the future. All moneys received and expended from the Disaster Fund shall be properly documented.

BE IT RESOLVED FURTHER that the sum of Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000) shall be transferred from the Inheritance Fund into the Disaster Fund. Said transfer shall be a loan from the Inheritance Fund to the Disaster Fund and shall be transferred back to the Inheritance Fund once disaster relief money is received from other sources.

Louise Niemann, UNL Extension Service, informed the board that their office has computers available and staff members willing to help the township officials and village officials get started working in the FEMA portal.

Moved by Steager, seconded by Birkel for the County to help with data entry into the FEMA portal for governmental entities not covered by the County. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Steager, Janak, and Birkel. The following voted nay: Whitmore, Bauer, Krafka, and Mach. Motion failed.

Supervisor Whitmore suggested that each board member contact the township and village officials within their district to confirm that someone has taken on the responsibility of getting the data entered into the FEMA portal.

Road Department, Jim McDonald, Highway Superintendent-

- 1. Update on the 2 Utilities Permits Requested by Settje Agri-Serivces 2 driveways, one in Olive Township & one in Union Township
 - a. McDonald looked at the permit sites and has suggested that a 50 ft. culvert be placed at both locations. Prior to a motion to approve the permits, a representative from Settje Agri-Services asked to speak in regards to the necessity of the 80ft request for the culvert. Jessica Kolterman was also present and speaking on behalf of Settje, the property owners, and her own company, Lincoln Premium Poultry. Both representatives explained to the board the safety issues of not having a wide enough driveway. The driveway policy for Butler County was brought into question, stating that the policy says up to a 60 foot culvert can be approved by the Highway Superintendent. 6. The annual salary for the office of the County Sheriff be established at \$68,340.00 for the calendar 2020, plus an annual increase during the term of office (2021, 2022) based on the Consumer Price Index as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor; said increase to be not less than two percent (2%) and said increase not to exceed five percent (5%).

7. The annual salary for the office of the County Attorney be established at \$68,340.00 for the calendar 2020, plus an annual increase during the term of office (2021, 2022) based on the Consumer Price Index as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor; said increase to be not less than two percent (2%) and said increase not to exceed five percent (5%). The County Attorney position is designated as part-time.

8. The annual salary for the office of the County Surveyor be established at \$17,136.00 for the calendar 2020, plus an annual increase during the term of office (2021, 2022) based on the Consumer Price Index as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U. S. Department of Labor; said increase to be not less than two percent (2%) and said increase not to exceed five percent (5%). The County Surveyor position is designated as part-time and would include those duties prescribed by the Nebraska Statutes. This position receives no health or dental insurance benefits.

9. The annual salaries for the Deputy Clerk, Deputy Assessor, Deputy Clerk of the District Court, Deputy Treasurer and Deputy County Attorney be established at 75% of the Official's salary for the calendar year 2020, plus an annual increase during the term of office (2021, 2022) based on the Consumer Price Index as established by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, U.S. Department of Labor; said increase to be not less than two percent (2%) and said increase not to exceed five percent (5%).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the county reserves the right to enter into any agreement with an elected official or officials who is qualified to serve as the budget-making authority as may be approved by the Board. The Chairman called the meeting to order, and announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted in the meeting room.

County Treasurer/6 Month Report

The County Treasurer's Statement for the period January 1, 2019 through June 30, 2019 was presented for the board's review. The statement was accepted and placed on file.

Road Department

-Approve Utility Permit for Corey Vandenberg for Butler Co Landfill – water line and phone cable

Moved by Janak and seconded by Steager to approve the utility permit as presented. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Janak, Steager, Krafka, Bauer, Whitmore, Birkel and Mach. The following voted nay: NONE. Motion carried.

-Discussion/Possible Action – Dwight/Brainard Asphalt Overlay Pay Application Claim

County Clerk Laska requested clarification regarding how the claim should be allocated. Noting that a portion was set aside in the Special Road Fund and that there are funds available in the Highway Bridge Buy Back Fund however there would still be a balance. The board directed Laska the remainder would come out of Inheritance Tax.

-Township Interlocal Agreement/Possible Action & Acceptance

No action was taken at this time. Representatives from Union Township and Ulysses Township noted that the agreement is very vague and needs some clarification. It was also noted that the County Attorney may have some questions as well. DOLLARS (\$5,000,000) FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING AND REDEEMING A PORTION OF THE COUNTY'S OUTSTANDING GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, SERIES 2012; DIRECTING THE APPLICATION OF THE PROCEEDS OF SAID BONDS; PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID BONDS; AUTHORIZING OFFICERS OF THE COUNTY TO DESIGNATE FINAL TERMS FOR SAID BONDS WITHIN STATED PARAMETERS; PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF TAXES TO PAY THE SAME; APPOINTING A PAYING AGENT AND REGISTRAR; PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF THE BONDS; AUTHORIZING THE DELIVERY OF THE BONDS TO THE PURCHASER; APPROVING POST-ISSUANCE TAX COMPLIANCE POLICIES; AND PROVIDING FOR THE DISPOSITION OF BOND PROCEEDS.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CHAIRPERSON AND BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF BUTLER, IN THE STATE OF NEBRASKA, that the Original Resolution is hereby amended and restated in its entirety as follows:

Section 1. The Chairperson and County Board of Supervisors (the "Board") hereby find and determine as follows:

(a) the County has had and presently has a population in excess of three thousand six hundred inhabitants and a taxable value of taxable property in excess of twenty-eight million six hundred thousand dollars, and has previously established and now owns and operates a hospital, including real and personal property, as provided in Section 23-3501, R.R.S. Neb., as amended (the "Hospital");

(b) there have been heretofore issued and are now outstanding and unpaid valid and interest bearing bonds of The County of Butler, in the State of Nebraska (the "County"), as follows:

said bonds are hereinafter referred to as the "Called Outstanding Bonds"; the Called Outstanding Bonds were issued for the purpose of providing for an addition to, improvements and equipment for the existing Hospital facilities owned by the County, and paying certain costs of issuance, pursuant to Section 23-3508 and other applicable sections, R.R.S. Neb. 2012, as amended;

(c) the Called Outstanding Bonds are subject to redemption on or after May 15, 2017; by resolution of this Board adopted contemporaneously with this Resolution (the "Call Resolution"), the Called Outstanding

Bonds have been authorized to be called for redemption on such date as determined by an authorized officer of the County (the "Redemption Date");

(d) since the Called Outstanding Bonds were issued, the rates of interest have so declined in the markets that by taking up and paying off said bonds prior to and on said date of redemption, a substantial savings in the amount of yearly running interest will be made to the County;

(e) for the purpose of making said redemption, it is for the best interest of the County to issue refunding bonds of the County in the principal amount of not to exceed \$5,000,000 pursuant to Section 10-142, R.R.S. Neb. 2012, as amended, and all laws amendatory thereof or supplementary thereto, and that all conditions for the issuance of such refunding bonds do exist and have been done as required by law.

Section 2. For the purposes as set out in Section 1 hereof, there shall be and there hereby are ordered issued General Obligation Refunding Bonds, Series 2019 (the "Bonds"), in the aggregate principal amount of not to exceed Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000), with said Bonds to mature and become due on such dates and in such years and in such amounts and bear interest at the rates per annum as shall be determined in a written designation (the "Designation") signed by the Chairperson of the Board, Clerk of the County, the Chief Executive Officer of the Hospital or Chief Financial Officer of the Hospital (each, an "Authorized Officer") on behalf of the County and which may be agreed to by D.A. Davidson & Co. (the "Underwriter"), which Designation may also determine or modify the mandatory redemption provisions (if any), and pricing terms as set forth in Section 8 below, all within the following limitations:

(a) the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds shall not exceed \$5,000,000, provided, however, in the event the Bonds are sold at a net original issue discount such aggregate principal amount may be increased in such amount as is necessary to compensate for any such net original issue discount;

(b) the aggregate amount of original issue premium and original issue discount (if any) may result in an aggregate net original issue discount (if any) not in excess of two percent (2.00%) of the stated principal amount of the Bonds;

(c) the longest maturity of the Bonds may not be later than December 31, 2032;

(d) the Bonds shall bear interest at such rates per annum so that debt service payable on the Bonds provides at least a net present value savings to the County over the debt service payable on the Called Outstanding Bonds in an amount satisfactory to the County (the execution of the Designation by an Authorized Officer shall be conclusive evidence that such net present value savings is satisfactory to the County);

(e) two or more of the principal maturities may be combined and issued as "term bonds" and the Authorized Officer may determine the mandatory sinking fund payments and mandatory redemption amounts; any Bonds issued as "term bonds" shall be redeemed at a redemption price equal to 100% of the principal amount thereof plus accrued interest thereon to the date of redemption and may be selected for redemption by any random method of selection determined appropriate by the Paying Agent and Registrar (as hereinafter designated) or by the Depository (as hereinafter designated).

The Authorized Officers (or any one of them) are hereby authorized to make such determinations on behalf of the Board and to evidence the same by execution and delivery of the Designation and such determinations, when made and agreed to by the Underwriter, shall constitute the action of the County without further action of the Board.

The Bonds shall be issued in fully registered form in the denomination of \$5,000 or any whole multiple thereof. The date of original issue for the Bonds shall be the date of delivery thereof. Interest on the Bonds, at the respective rates for each maturity, shall be payable semiannually on January 15 and July 15 of each year commencing January 15, 2020 (or such other date or dates as may be determined in the Designation, each an "Interest Payment Date"), and the Bonds

shall bear such interest from the date of original issue or the most recent Interest Payment Date to which interest has been paid or provided for, whichever is later. The interest due on each Interest Payment Date shall be payable to the registered owners of record as of the close of business on the last business day of the month immediately preceding the month in which the Interest Payment Date occurs (or such other record date as may be determined in the Designation, the "Record Date"), subject to the provisions of Section 4 hereof. The Bonds shall be numbered from 1 upwards in the order of their issuance. No Bond shall be issued originally or upon transfer or partial redemption having more than one principal maturity. The initial bond numbering and principal amounts for each of the Bonds issued shall be designated by the County's Treasurer as directed by the initial purchaser thereof. Payments of interest due on the Bonds prior to maturity or earlier redemption shall be made by the Paying Agent and Registrar, as designated pursuant to Section 3 hereof, by mailing a check or draft in the amount due for such interest on each Interest Payment Date to the registered owner of each Bond, as of the Record Date for such Interest Payment Date, to such owner's registered address as shown on the books of registration as required to be maintained in Section 3 hereof. Payments of principal and interest accrued thereon due at maturity or at any date fixed for redemption prior to maturity shall be made by said Paying Agent and Registrar to the registered owners upon presentation and surrender of the Bonds to said Paying Agent and Registrar. The County and said Paying Agent and Registrar may treat the registered owner of any Bond as the absolute owner of such Bond for the purpose of making payments thereon and for all other purposes and neither the County nor the Paying Agent and Registrar shall be affected by any notice or knowledge to the contrary, whether such Bond or any installment of interest due thereon shall be overdue or not. All payments on account of interest or principal made to the registered owner of any Bond in accordance with the terms of this Resolution shall be valid and effectual and shall be a discharge of the County and said Paying Agent and Registrar, in respect of the liability upon the Bonds or claims for interest to the extent of the sum or sums so paid.

Section 3. Unless otherwise provided in the Designation, Union Bank and Trust Company, Lincoln, Nebraska, is hereby designated as the Paying Agent and Registrar for the Bonds (the "Paying Agent and Registrar"). Said Paying Agent and Registrar shall serve in such capacities under the terms of an agreement entitled "Paying Agent and Registrar's Agreement" between the County and said Paying Agent and Registrar, in substantially the form presented in connection with the adoption of this Resolution, which form is hereby approved. The Chairperson and County Clerk are hereby authorized to execute said agreement on behalf of the County in the form presented or with such changes, modifications and completions as such officers shall deem appropriate on behalf of the County. The Paying Agent and Registrar shall keep and maintain for the County books for the registration and transfer of the Bonds at its principal corporate trust office. The names and registered addresses of the registered owner or owners of the Bonds shall at all times be recorded in such books. Any Bond may be transferred pursuant to its provisions at the principal corporate trust office of said Paying Agent and Registrar by surrender of such Bond for cancellation, accompanied by a written instrument of transfer, in form satisfactory to said Paying Agent and Registrar, duly executed by the registered owner in person or by said owner's duly authorized agent, and thereupon the Paying Agent and Registrar, on behalf of the County, will deliver at its principal corporate trust office (or send by registered mail to the transferee owner or owners thereof at such transferee owner's or owners' risk and expense), registered in the name of such transferee owner or owners, a new Bond or Bonds of the same interest rate, aggregate principal amount and maturity. To the extent of the denominations authorized for the Bonds by this Resolution, one Bond may be transferred for several such Bonds of the same interest rate and maturity, and for a like aggregate principal amount, and several such Bonds may be transferred for one or several such Bonds, respectively, of the same interest rate and maturity and for a like aggregate principal amount. In every case of transfer of a Bond, the surrendered Bond shall be cancelled and destroyed. All Bonds issued upon transfer of the Bonds so surrendered shall be valid obligations of the County evidencing the same obligations as the Bonds surrendered and shall be entitled to all the benefits and protection of this Resolution to the same extent as the Bonds upon transfer of which they were delivered. The County and said Paying Agent and Registrar shall not be required to transfer any Bond during any period from any Record Date until its immediately following Interest Payment Date or to transfer any Bond called for redemption for a period of 30 days next preceding the date fixed for redemption.

Section 4. In the event that payments of interest due on the Bonds on an Interest Payment Date are not timely made, such interest shall cease to be payable to the registered owners as of the Record Date for such Interest Payment Date and shall be payable to the registered owners of the Bonds as of a special date of record for payment of such

defaulted interest as shall be designated by the Paying Agent and Registrar whenever monies for the purpose of paying such defaulted interest become available.

Section 5. If the date for payment of the principal of or interest on the Bonds shall be a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday or a day on which banking institutions in the city where the principal corporate trust office of the Paying Agent and Registrar is located are authorized by law or executive order to close, then the date for such payment shall be the next succeeding day which is not a Saturday, Sunday, legal holiday or a day on which such banking institutions are authorized to close, and payment on such day shall have the same force and effect as if made on the nominal date of payment.

Section 6. The Bonds shall be subject to redemption, in whole or in part, prior to maturity at any time on or after the fifth anniversary of the date of original issue thereof (or such other date as may be determined in the Designation), at par (or such other redemption price as may be determined in the Designation) plus the interest accrued on the principal amount being redeemed to the date fixed for redemption. The County shall select the Bonds to be redeemed for such optional redemption in its sole discretion. The Bonds shall be redeemed only in amounts of \$5,000 or whole multiples thereof. Any Bond redeemed in part only shall be surrendered to the Paying Agent and Registrar in exchange for a new Bond or Bonds, of the same maturity and interest rate, evidencing the unredeemed principal thereof. Notice of redemption of any Bond called for redemption shall be given, at the direction of the County in the case of optional redemptions and without further direction in the case of mandatory redemptions, by said Paying Agent and Registrar by mail not less than 30 days prior to the date fixed for redemption, first-class, postage prepaid, sent to the registered owner of such Bond at said owner's registered address. Such notice shall designate the Bond or Bonds to be redeemed by maturity or otherwise, the date of original issue and the date fixed for redemption and shall state that such Bond or Bonds are to be presented for prepayment at the principal corporate trust office of said Paying Agent and Registrar. In case of any Bond partially redeemed, such notice shall specify the portion of the principal amount of such Bond to be redeemed. No defect in the mailing of notice for any Bond shall affect the sufficiency of the proceedings of the County designating the Bonds called for redemption or the effectiveness of such call for Bonds for which notice by mail has been properly given and the County shall have the right to direct further notice of redemption for any such Bond for which defective notice has been given. In the event term maturities and mandatory redemption amounts are determined in the Designation, the provisions of this Section 6 shall apply generally to mandatory redemptions. Any such mandatory redemptions shall be in amounts and on terms set forth in the Designation, at the principal amount redeemed plus accrued interest to the date set for redemption.

This bond is transferable by the registered owner or such owner's attorney duly authorized in writing at the principal corporate trust office of the Paying Agent and Registrar upon surrender and cancellation of this bond, and thereupon a new bond or bonds of the same total principal amount and interest rate and maturity will be issued to the transferee as provided in the Resolution authorizing said bonds subject to the limitations therein prescribed. DTC OR A NOMINEE, TRANSFEREE OR ASSIGNEE OF DTC OF THIS BOND MAY NOT RELY UPON THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT INDICATED HEREON AS THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT HEREOF OUTSTANDING AND UNPAID. Section 8. Each of the Bonds shall be executed on behalf of the County with the manual or facsimile signatures of the Chairperson of the Board and Clerk of the County. The Bonds shall be issued initially as "book-entry only" bonds

under the services of The Depository Trust Company (the "Depository"), with one typewritten bond per maturity being issued to the Depository. In such connection said officers of the County are authorized to execute and deliver a Letter of Representations (the "Letter of Representations") in the form required by the Depository (which may be in the form of a blanket letter previously executed and delivered by the County), for and on behalf of the County, which shall thereafter govern matters with respect to registration, transfer, payment and redemption of the Bonds. Upon issuance of the Bonds as "book-entry-only" bonds, the following provisions shall apply:

(a) The County and the Paying Agent and Registrar shall have no responsibility or obligation to any broker-dealer, bank or other financial institution for which the Depository holds Bonds as securities depository (each, a "Bond Participant") or to any person who is an actual purchaser of a Bond from a Bond Participant while the Bonds are in book-entry form (each, a "Beneficial Owner") with respect to the following:

(i) the accuracy of the records of the Depository, any nominees of the Depository or any Bond Participant with respect to any ownership interest in the Bonds,

(ii) the delivery to any Bond Participant, any Beneficial Owner or any other person, other than the Depository, of any notice with respect to the Bonds, including any notice of redemption, or

(iii) the payment to any Bond Participant, any Beneficial Owner or any other person, other than the Depository, of any amount with respect to the Bonds.

The Paying Agent and Registrar shall make payments with respect to the Bonds only to or upon the order of the Depository or its nominee, and all such payments shall be valid and effective fully to satisfy and discharge the obligations with respect to such Bonds to the extent of the sum or sums so paid. No person other than the Depository shall receive an authenticated Bond, except as provided in (e) below.

(b) Upon receipt by the Paying Agent and Registrar of written notice from the Depository to the effect that the Depository is unable or unwilling to discharge its responsibilities, the Paying Agent and Registrar shall issue, transfer and exchange Bonds requested by the Depository in appropriate amounts. Whenever the Depository requests the Paying Agent and Registrar to do so, the Paying Agent and Registrar will cooperate with the Depository in taking appropriate action after reasonable notice (i) to arrange, with the prior written consent of the County, for a substitute depository willing and able upon reasonable and customary terms to maintain custody of the Bonds or (ii) to make available Bonds registered in whatever name or names the Beneficial Owners transferring or exchanging such Bonds shall designate.

(c) If the County determines that it is desirable that certificates representing the Bonds be delivered to the ultimate Beneficial Owners of the Bonds and so notifies the Paying Agent and Registrar in writing, the Paying Agent and Registrar shall so notify the Depository, whereupon the Depository will notify the Bond Participants of the availability through the Depository of bond certificates representing the Bonds. In such event, the Paying Agent and Registrar shall issue, transfer and exchange bond certificates representing the Bonds as requested by the Depository in appropriate amounts and in authorized denominations.

(d) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Resolution to the contrary, so long as any Bond is registered in the name of the Depository or any nominee thereof, all payments with respect to such Bond and all notices with respect to such Bond shall be made and given, respectively, to the Depository as provided in the Letter of Representations.

(e) Registered ownership of the Bonds may be transferred on the books of registration maintained by the Paying Agent and Registrar, and the Bonds may be delivered in physical form to the following:

(i) any successor securities depository or its nominee; or

(ii) any person, upon (A) the resignation of the Depository from its functions as depository or (B) termination of the use of the Depository pursuant to this Section and the terms of the Paying Agent and Registrar's Agreement.

Said initial purchasers shall have the right to direct the registration of the Bonds and the denominations thereof within each maturity, subject to the restrictions of this Resolution. The County Clerk shall record the proceedings of the Board in the book of records of the proceedings of the County and make and certify a transcript of the proceedings of the Board with respect to the Bonds which shall be delivered to said purchaser. Such purchaser and its agents, representatives and counsel (including its bond counsel) are hereby authorized to take such actions on behalf of the County as are necessary to effectuate the issuance and sale of the Bonds, including without limitation, authorizing the release of the Bonds by the Depository at closing. Each Authorized Officer is hereby authorized to execute and deliver the Bond Purchase Agreement, in substantially the form presented herewith but with any changes deemed necessary and appropriate by such Authorized Officers, for and on behalf of the County.

Section 9. The net sale proceeds of the Bonds, along with funds of the County on hand, shall be applied to the payment and satisfaction of all of the principal of and the interest on the Called Outstanding Bonds as called for redemption on the Redemption Date. Accrued interest received from the sale of the Bonds, if any, shall be applied to pay interest first falling due on the Bonds. Expenses of issuance of the Bonds may be paid from the proceeds of the Bonds.

Section 10. The holders of the Bonds shall be subrogated to all rights of the holders of the Called Outstanding Bonds from and after their payment and redemption prior to and on their respective maturity dates and redemption

date. For the prompt payment of the Bonds, both principal and interest as the same fall due, the County agrees that it shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property, except intangible property, in the County at such rate or rates, subject to applicable statutory limitations, as well as the County's constitutional limitation for levying taxes of 50 cents per \$100 of taxable value, as will provide funds which will be sufficient to make payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds as the same fall due, to the extent not paid from other sources lawfully available for such payments. The County covenants and agrees that it will observe all budget and spending limitations now or hereafter imposed by law in such a manner that a sufficient portion of its tax levy or other monies shall be lawfully available to pay all principal and interest due on the Bonds. The obligation to levy and collect taxes pursuant to this paragraph shall not be reduced or limited by the receipt of revenues from the Hospital sufficient for the payment of principal and interest on the Bonds; provided, however, that the County shall not be obligated to levy and collect taxes required by this paragraph to the extent (but only to the extent) and so long as revenues deposited by the Hospital with the County are sufficient for payment of principal and interest when due. The County Treasurer shall establish a separate fund to hold revenues received by the County from the Hospital for payment of principal and interest on the Bonds. The County covenants that the principal and interest payable on the Bonds will not exceed any limitation imposed by law, and that such amounts are not such as may reasonably be expected to require County to levy taxes in excess of any applicable levy limit. Specifically, but without limitation, County covenants and agrees that taxes levied and appropriations made to pay principal and interest on the Bonds, together with other taxes levied and appropriations made by County, will not exceed the limitations imposed by Section 77-3442 R.R.S. Neb. 2009, as amended, and Section 23-3508, R.R.S. Neb. 2012, as amended, and by the Constitution of the State of Nebraska all to the extent applicable to the Bonds. Such taxes are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of principal and interest on the Bonds.

Section 11. The County hereby covenants to the purchasers and registered owners of the Bonds hereby authorized that it will make no use of the proceeds of said issue, including monies held in any sinking fund for the Bonds, which would cause the Bonds to be "arbitrage bonds" within the meaning of Sections 103(b) and 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and further covenants to comply with said Sections 103(b) and 148 and all applicable regulations thereunder throughout the term of said bond issue. The County hereby covenants and agrees to take all actions necessary under the Code to maintain the tax-exempt status (as to taxpayers generally) of interest payable on the Bonds. - (7) modifications to rights of the holders of the Bonds, if material;
- (8) bond calls, if material, and tender offers;
- (9) defeasances;
- (10) release, substitution, or sale of property securing repayment of the Bonds, if material;
- (11) rating changes;

(12) bankruptcy, insolvency, receivership or similar events of the County (this event is considered to occur when any of the following occur: the appointment of a receiver, fiscal agent or similar officer for the County in a proceeding under the U.S. Bankruptcy Code or in any other proceeding under state or federal law in which a court or governmental authority has assumed jurisdiction over substantially all of the assets or business of the County, or if such jurisdiction has been assumed by leaving the existing governing body and officials or officers in possession but subject to the supervision and orders of a court or governmental authority, or the entry of an order confirming a plan of reorganization, arrangement or liquidation by a court or governmental authority having supervision or jurisdiction over substantially all of the assets or business of the County);

(13) the consummation of a merger, consolidation, or acquisition involving the County or the sale of all or substantially all of the assets of the County, other than in the ordinary course of business, the entry into a definitive agreement to undertake such an action or the termination of a definitive agreement relating to any such actions, other than pursuant to its terms, if material;

(14) appointment of a successor or additional trustee or the change of name of a trustee, if material;

(15) incurrence of a financial obligation, if material, or agreement to covenants, events of default, remedies, priority rights or other similar terms of a financial obligation, any of which affect security holders, if material; or

(16) default, event of acceleration, termination event, modification of terms, or other similar events under the terms of a financial obligation, any of which reflect financial difficulties.

The County has not undertaken to provide notice of the occurrence of any other event, except the events listed above.

The County agrees that all documents provided to the MSRB under the terms of this continuing disclosure undertaking shall be in such electronic format and accompanied by such identifying information as shall be prescribed by the MSRB. The County reserves the right to modify from time to time the specific types of information provided or the format of the presentation of such information or the accounting methods in accordance with which such information is presented, to the extent necessary or appropriate in the judgment of the County, consistent with the Rule. The County agrees that such covenants are for the benefit of the registered owners of the Bonds (including Beneficial Owners) and that such covenants may be enforced by any registered owner or Beneficial Owner, provided that any such right to enforcement shall be limited to specific enforcement of such undertaking and any failure shall not constitute an event of default under the Resolution. The continuing disclosure obligations of the County, as described above, shall cease when none of the Bonds remain outstanding. The County reserves the right to enter into an agreement or agreements (the "Dissemination Agreement") with a dissemination agent to be selected by an Authorized Officer (the "Dissemination Agent") for purposes of assisting the County in complying with its obligations under this continuing disclosure undertaking. Each Authorized Officer is authorized to negotiate, execute and deliver a Dissemination Agreement with the Dissemination Agent in form satisfactory to such Authorized Officer, with the execution by such Authorized Officer of the Dissemination Agreement being conclusive evidence of its approval on behalf of the County. In order to promote compliance with certain federal tax and securities laws relating to the bonds herein authorized (as well as other outstanding bonds) the policy and procedures attached hereto as <u>Exhibit "A"</u> (the "Post-Issuance Compliance Policy and Procedures") are hereby adopted and approved in all respects. To the extent that there is any inconsistency between the attached Post-Issuance Compliance Policy and Procedures and any similar policy or procedures previously adopted and approved, the Post-Issuance Compliance Policy and Procedures shall control.

Section 15. Each of the Authorized Officers are hereby authorized to approve, on behalf of the County, an official statement (which may include preliminary and final) relating to the Bonds. Such official statement shall be delivered in accordance with applicable securities laws.

Section 16. The Chairperson and each member of the Board, the Clerk and Treasurer of the County, or any one of them, are hereby authorized to take such actions and to execute and deliver for and on behalf of the County all other documents and instruments necessary in connection with the issuance of said Bonds.

Scott Buresh and Company – Road Department Issues

Mr. Buresh addressed the board and asked the following questions. What is the plan of action? The board responded that they had driven their districts and identified problem areas and assigned priority. They gave those suggestions to the Road and Bridge committee and that committee is working alongside the Hwy Superintendent to get the priority areas fixed. Buresh then presented the board with pictures of equipment that has been sitting idle and has weeds growing around it. Buresh then questioned the board regarding the difference between the estimate and the actual bill for the Highway Dept sign. Buresh & Company stated they would be at the next meeting to discuss the Highway Department again.

Discussion/Possible Action regarding further expenditures on the Highway Department Building

Supervisor Scot Bauer addressed the board that he has had constituents call him concerning the renovation of the Highway Department building. Their concern is that while the roads are still a mess that there shouldn't be further spending on the building. Moved by Bauer and seconded by Steager to stop further spending by the Highway Department on the Highway Department Building other than utilities with a re-evaluation in 3 months. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Bauer, Krafka, Steager, Janak, Birkel, Whitmore and Mach. The following voted nay: NONE. Motion carried.

At 11:51 a.m., Chairman Mach announced that the board would take a short recess.

At 11:57 a.m., Chairman Mach announced that the board would reconvene.

Discussion on 2019-2020 County Budget

Laska presented to the Board the proposed budget that has been prepared to date. She noted that the overall valuation for the county went down \$53,176,539. She reviewed last year's tax rate and levy with the board. It was noted that some changes that have been made to the budget are the following that will affect the overall budget. The County Attorney's budget has been increased \$10,000 for legal fees, the Detention Center's budget has been increased \$50,000 for medical expenses. The Road department has been increased \$175,000 for additional gravel allotment. \$250,000 will be transferred from Inheritance Tax to reduce the property tax request. It was also discussed to reduce the estimated Road Revenue from \$700, 000 down to \$550,000 due to fewer Interlocal Agreements and changes in Interlocal Agreements. Revenue for the Detention Center was increased by \$60,000 for prisoner contracts and commissary sales.

Discussion of Gravel Allotment for mail routes

Per the gravel policy, mail routes are to get 44 yards/mile; however in the previous year between the gravel produced by the pit and the gravel allowed in the budget from other companies there was not enough to put 44 yards/mile. It was noted that during the budget discussion the addition of \$175,000 to the gravel budget should help with this problem. Along with the fact the gravel pit is producing a lot more gravel than it has produced in the last few years, they have hit a good gravel pocket.

Discussion regarding Contracting with Spy Glass to Audit Communication Bill – Update

Laska reported that she has discussed with Applied Connective the contract with Spy Glass. It is Applied Connective's opinion that while the previous contract was beneficial to the county that it has also caused some contractual issues now. Also they said that they can provide the same service at no cost to the county.

Discussion/Possible Action Hiring a Human Resource Manager

County Attorney, Julie Reiter, presented to the board the growing need for a Human Resources Department. The need is ever growing and should not be ignored much longer. There are things that this position can manage that are not getting done at this time. This position would ensure that County Handbook policies are being followed, they can facilitate the hiring needs of the county and help with employee evaluations. The board instructed Laska to create a budget for the position to include in this year's budget.

Resolution 2019-33/Allocation of Levy Authority to Townships, Fire Districts and Ag Society

Moved by Steager and seconded by Bauer to approve Resolution 2019-33. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Steager, Krafka, Bauer, Whitmore, Birkel, Janak and Mach. The following voted nay: NONE. Motion carried.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS BUTLER COUNTY, NEBRASKA RESOLUTION NO. 2019 – 33

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Nebraska Statute 77-3443, each County Board shall adopt a resolution by a majority vote of members present which determines a final allocation of levy authority to its political subdivisions, and

WHEREAS, political subdivisions as defined in said statute are "all political subdivisions <u>other</u> than school districts, community colleges, natural resources districts, educational service units, cities, villages, counties, rural and suburban fire protection districts that have levy authority pursuant to subsection (10) of section 77-3442, and sanitary and improvement districts, and

WHEREAS, statute states that they may levy taxes as provided by law, provided they do not collectively total more than fifteen cents per one hundred dollars of taxable valuation on any parcel or item of taxable property for all governments for which allocations are made by the County, and

WHEREAS, on or before August 1st, all political subdivisions subject to county levy authority must submit a preliminary request for levy allocation to the County Board, and

WHEREAS, failure of a political subdivision to do so shall preclude them from using procedures set forth in 77-3444, and

WHEREAS, Butler County has twenty-seven (27) such political subdivisions namely: Butler County Agricultural Society, Read Township, Ulysses Township, Plum Creek Township, Richardson Township, Reading Township, Union Township, Center Township, Oak Creek Township, Summit Township, Olive Township, Franklin Township, Skull Creek Township, Alexis Township, Savannah Township, Bone Creek Township, Linwood Township, Platte Township, Ulysses Fire District #2, Rising City Fire District #3, Bellwood Fire District #5, Dwight Fire District #6, Bruno Fire District #7, Linwood Fire District #8, David City Fire District #9, Brainard Fire District #10 and Abie Fire District #11.

A meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Butler County, Nebraska was held on the 3rd day of September, 2019 at the Butler County Courthouse in David City, Nebraska at 9:00 a.m.

Present were the following: David W. Mach, Tony Krafka, Scot Bauer, Anthony Whitmore, Max Birkel and Greg Janak. Absent: Scott Steager.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all present.

The Chairman called the meeting to order, and announced that a complete copy of the Open Meetings Act is posted in the meeting room.

Road Department

- Update on Roads

Highway Superintendent, Jim McDonald, addressed the board with an update on the county roads since the last meeting. The culvert on 'A' Street passed the compaction and grade test. The Hwy Dept. has been working or worked on the following: 26th & L culvert replacement, spoke with the Dairy regarding Minimum Maintenance roads for chopping. They have had 2 motor graders in the Union and Ulysses Townships when additional motor graders have been available. The Highway Dept. has been working to get all gravel orders filled either by contracting it out or hauling from the pit. Platte Twp is now being maintained by the County, they have agreed to an hourly contract with the Highway Dept. The motor grader operators have started filling in their maps, color coordinating where they have been and on what days, they are to return those to the Highway Superintendent and will be kept on file at the Road Department. The Ulysses South Bridge Replacement scheduled to start in March may be moved up to as early as November based on the Contractor's schedule. The Highway Superintendent notified the board that the 1983 Mack Truck is having engine troubles and will cost \$15,000-20,000 to fix, he asked what they wanted to do with it.

The board requested an update on the B Road Bridge and the repairs need to get it open for harvest. It was noted that the Townships requested that it be closed until the Bridge can be replaced. The board agreed that it should be repaired so it will be functioning for harvest this year and instructed the Highway Superintendent not to forget about the bridge and to get it replaced.

It was also brought up that the county might want to consider contracting all bridge work in the future.

Discussion on Flu Vaccinations for Employees

Laska informed the board that there has been no new info regarding the cost of the flu vaccinations and is hoping to have all of the information by the next meeting.

Notice from Lower Platte North Natural Resources District – Hazard Mitigation Plan Update Round One Public Meeting

Presented to the Board was a public notice regarding the Lower Platte North NRD – Hazard Mitigation Plan Update Round One meetings being held in Wahoo and David City later in September. Supervisor Janak mentioned he would be attending; Floodplain Administrators are being encouraged to go.

Correspondence - Letter from Jim Truksa

Chairman Mach presented a letter that was addressed to the Board from Jim Truksa. Mr. Truksa wanted to clear the air regarding the allegations made against him by the Highway Superintendent regarding withholding information from the auditors. Mr. Truksa has also been in contact with the State Auditors regarding this claim. Mr. Truksa was present at the meeting during this discussion and stated he has inquired what it would cost to re-audit the years in question to clear his name.

Scott Buresh and Company – Road Conditions & Budget Concerns

Mr. Buresh addressed the Board with his concerns regarding the roads and their conditions. Buresh asked what had been done since the last meeting. Mach and Janak summarized what was reported at the beginning of the meeting. Buresh was asked by Supervisor Janak if he had roads in his area that needed addressing, his response was that he's concerned about the condition of the entire county. It was brought to the Boards attention that there are still roads closed from the flood, 2 by Ulysses and also County Road 37 between H & I. Mr. Buresh addressed a concern that he'd been in contact with the schools and had asked if the Highway Superintendent had been in contact with them. Buresh noted that both schools stated they had not spoken with the Highway Superintendent in the last few weeks. Buresh stated that Mr. McDonald is lying and asked the board why they are allowing it? He said, "If these things are being stated during an open meeting, what is going on outside of the meetings. He then requested that the Board remove the Highway Superintendent. Mr. Truksa then approached the board and brought to their attention a situation that was brought to his attention last week. The situation was regarding J Rd south toward Ulysses. The road had needed gravel and it was delivered, which was good, however, last Tuesday, a motor grader operator had gone over the road and the newly delivered gravel had been pushed in the ditch. Truksa said he drove over to take a look and that was his observation as well. A question presented to the Board was whether or not the businesses that are contributing to the road issues could cost share the maintenance of the roads. The Board said that it is a possibility in the future, however, it wouldn't be right to require monetary help when the roads have been in disrepair. Once they are in better shape that may be an idea they may address with the businesses.

Public Hearing for 2019-2020 County Budget

The public hearing is being held for the purpose of hearing support, opposition, criticism, suggestions or observations of taxpayers relating to the proposed budget.

Moved by Whitmore and seconded by Krafka to open the public hearing for the 2019-2020 County Budget at 10:00 a.m. Upon roll call vote the following voted aye: Whitmore, Bauer, Krafka, Janak, Birkel and Mach. The following voted nay: NONE. Absent: Steager. Motion carried.

The 2018-2019 Butler County Budget was presented.

Mr. Truksa approached the board with questions regarding the road budget. He noted that the Road budget is up 15.7% over last year. He also noted that personnel services is up 9% over the previous year. He asked if the Board intended to

hire more employees for the next fiscal year and if that is why personnel services is up. He noted that the gravel budget is up \$300,000 and he's glad to see that, however, if the operators are going to continue to push the gravel into the ditches that will not be enough. He questioned whether some of the expenses for gravel that the county intends to incur could be paid out of the disaster fund. Lastly, Mr. Truksa noted that the Road budget has increased 41% since 2013 and that increase is without a steel budget.

Sheriff Tom Dion approached the board stating that he realized he'd made an error in his budget request. He has two patrol cars that are needing to be outfitted with equipment, the estimate he received is approximately \$40,000. He said he has some room in his budget but not all of it.

The Board further discussed the budget, instructing Laska to add \$20,000 to the sheriff's budget to outfit the patrol cars; however, as to not increase the property tax request they also instructed her to subtract the \$20,000 out of the Road Department reducing personnel services. A summary of Budget changes will be published at the time of filing the budget with the State Auditors.

No further comment was made regarding the budget.

Jim Rerucha, Rebuttal to statements made at the September 3, 2019 board meeting

Mr. Rerucha approached the board to defend himself regarding comments that were made at the September 3, 2019 board meeting. He stated that the minutes did not reflect these comments, however, he had heard they were made. The comment he referred to was that the current Highway Superintendent is getting more done than the previous highway superintendent. As the former Highway Superintendent he wanted it on record the reason why certain projects were not completed during his time. He lastly stated that he feels there was an injustice because the statement was made and he was not present to be able to defend himself and the board should not condone bringing up names of employees or past employees in a negative manner.

Jim Rerucha, Questions on road projects regarding drainage issues and the 1 & 6 year road plans

Mr. Rerucha presented before the board his concern that policy and procedure was not followed on road project on County Road V in sections 27 and 28. He stated that he was instructed to remove a diversion plug and that during repair

the road height and width were changed. He does not feel that standards and protocols were followed nor were the section files consulted. He's concerned for the county and what this change in road width and height could do for other areas. Mr. Rerucha asked why this project was done if it was not on the 1 & 6 year road plans and why it took precedence over the 1 & 6 year road plan projects. Mach stated that the road needed to be fixed because it had flood damage from the floods in March. The landowners and the people that have cabins on Smokey L Lake are happy that they can get to their properties. Mr. Rerucha said he was glad that the people are happy, however, he is concerned if standards and protocols continue to be ignored the outcome may not be the same in the future. Mr. Rerucha was also concerned as to whether elevation shots were taken of these roads. Mach stated he thought that the surveyor had been down there. Rerucha stated the importance of dotting i's and crossing t's with all of the road projects.

Mike Hoelscher & Katy Drake, KALM Energy; Scott Zaruba, Black Hills Energy - Approval of Utility Permits for natural gas lines to chicken houses in Summit and Olive Townships

Katy Drake, KALM Energy; Scott Zaruba and Chris Avery, Black Hills Energy presented before the board plans for a utility permit. They presented minutes from the Summit Township board meeting where they presented the permit for their approval on 10/2/2019. The board advised that once the township has signed the utility permit, they would like the Highway Superintendent to review the permit; once that is complete; they can readdress the board for approval.

Andy Yost, Detention Center Administrator – Discussion/Possible Action – Approval for new radios for the Detention Center

Andy Yost presented to the board the need for new radios for the Detention Center. He said his radios are failing and that he had not foreseen this and did not budget for the expense. He explained that these radios are for the safety of the detention center employees and that they are a necessity. The cost to purchase 5 new radios is \$3,058. In the past the detention center has leased the radios for \$200/month per radio. The board stated that it would be smart to purchase the radios. They discussed that they don't typically agree to help pay for equipment; that it should be budgeted annually. Yost said he understands that, however, he doesn't like to pad his budget. He did explain to the board how much money the detention center is bringing in for the county and that since the beginning of this fiscal year they have averaged 31 prisoners a day. The board agreed that the radios were a necessity and acknowledged that they

Mark Doehling, Emergency Manager – Discussion/Possible Action – Community Wildfire Protection Plans (CWPP)

This is a collaborative plan to maximize coordination and communication between emergency response agencies and the community. Doehling stated that he would spearhead the whole process if the Board would give him authority. If neither party wishes to buy-out the other party's interest in the motor grader, the grader shall be sold as surplus property and the net proceeds paid to Union Township and Butler County in accord with their ownership interests.

- Discussion regarding a new driveway culvert that was promised 5 years ago

Brower presented before the board that he does not represent the owner of the lake; he represents the homeowner's association. He stated that approximately 5 years ago they were promised a new culvert into the driveway of the lake and it has never been installed. He mentioned that he has tried several times to contact the current Highway superintendent and the issue has never been addressed. Road Department

Update on Roads

Jim McDonald, Highway Superintendent updated the board on the work the Highway Dept has done since the last meeting. They have installed culverts and cleaned ditches. The pit is being dismantled for the winter. Since the last meeting, the culvert at Bowstring has been replaced. The County Surveyor took elevation shots; the recommendation from the roads department is to have the property owner or the Bowstring Association hire an engineer to do a hydraulic study. McDonald also suggested that in the future the supervisors should look at the driveway policy. He felt that the number of requests hinders the Highway Dept's ability to stay on task with the 1 & 6 year plans. He reviewed the number of driveways and culverts installed over the last several years and suggested that it is possible that the amount is a reason the previous highway superintendent was unable to get to all the projects completed that needed done. His suggestion was that the county could provide the culvert, however, charging the landowner for installation or having the landowner install the culvert themselves. The Supervisors said the policy was just revamped a few years ago and that the county installing the culverts and driveways was a courtesy to the taxpayers and they aren't looking to change at this time. Platte Township is still working on finalizing an interlocal agreement with the county for care of township roads. The supervisors asked McDonald to talk to the owners of the chicken houses about road haul agreements. Supervisor Whitmore asked McDonald about the gravel orders and township allotments, if the system for recording could be revamped so that if someone calls in to inquire about allotments or orders there's a system to get information to the person inquiring quicker.
