Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof, by Publication, a designated method for giving notice, as shown by the Proof of Publication attached to the minutes. Notice of this meeting was given to all members of the Board and a copy of their acknowledgement of receipt of notice and the agenda is attached to the minutes. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to all members of the board of this meeting. All proceedings hereafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Discussion/Possible action regarding snow removal for the courthouse parking lots & sidewalks

Sypal led the discussion regarding snow removal stating she's had several conversations with the road department and while it started out promising, Highway Superintendent Randy Isham said he can't guarantee he can get to the courthouse 100% of the time. She explained that she had no issue with Steager Lawn Service providing the service, she has issue with the standby fee that is being charged. She explained the board needs to be conscientious on spending taxpayer dollars. Steager explained the process of how they clean the sidewalks and parking lots. Sypal mentioned she called around to other snow removal companies and they don't charge the fee. Steager proposed that they continue using his company's services for the remainder of winter, then in June/July they go out for bid; he also said he would remove the standby fee. Moved by Sypal, seconded by Coufal to approve using Steager Lawn Service for snow removal for the remainder of the year. Upon roll call vote the following voted:

Sypal explained that it has been difficult to hire a part-time maintenance person and she's coming to the board to discuss whether they should look into increasing the hours and offering benefits to possibly get interested applicants. Human Resources director Heidi Loges discussed that currently it's not in the budget for maintenance. She provided the board with past overtime numbers and part-time employee hours for the last few years. To keep the meeting on track, this item is being tabled until later in the meeting.

Approval of utility permit for Tall Grass Energy trench across Road 43 East of Road E, Alexis Township

Highway Superintendent Randy Isham appeared before the board presenting a Utility permit for Tall Grass Energy to trench across Road 43 of Road E, Alexis Township. The water table is too high to bore under the road; Isham agrees that the water table is too high and said that Tall Grass has been great to work with through the process. Moved by Vandenberg, seconded by Krafka to approve the utility permit as presented. Upon roll call vote the following voted:

Laska explained to the board that the original quote the board received for this project was \$7,235. However, when Applied Connective was completing the project they discovered they needed to add an additional switch to complete the project. The added amount is \$850; Laska said it was still covered under the HAVA grant, the county will be reimbursed. Moved by Sypal, seconded by Griess to approve the additional \$850 for the Applied

Connective HAVA Grant project and pay it out of the Inheritance Fund, which will be reimbursed when grant funds are received. Upon roll call vote the following voted:
